CW4 Morgan is originally from Margate, Kent England. She moved to the United States in 1983 and grew up in a suburb of Syracuse, NY. In 2004 she became a US Citizen.

CW4 Morgan attended University of New York College at Fredonia and pursued a bachelor's degree in music performance. She also attended the University of Arizona where she completed her bachelor's degree in clarinet performance. She is currently in her last semester of graduate school completing a master's degree in organizational development through Webster University.

In 1998, CW4 Morgan joined the Army as a clarinetist. Her first assignment was with the Infantry Center Band at Fort Benning, GA. In 2002 she transferred to the Army Ground Forces Band at Fort McPherson, GA. In 2005 she was selected to be an instructor at the Non-Commissioned Officer's Academy at the US Army School of Music in Norfolk, VA. It was here that she was chosen to enter the Warrant Officer Program as an Army Bandmaster.

Ms. Morgan attended Warrant Officer Candidate School at Fort Rucker, AL in June 2007 and the Warrant Officer Basic Course at the US Army School of Music from July-December 2007. She then served as the commander of the 36th Army Band on Fort Huachuca, AZ from 2008-2010. In 2011 she transferred to Fort Carson, CO and took command of the 4th Infantry Division Band. In January of 2015 she moved to Watertown, NY where she commanded the 10th Mountain Division Band on Fort Drum. During her tenure on Fort Drum, she deployed to Afghanistan from 2015-2016. In July of 2017, she moved to Olympia, WA where she served as the commander for America's First Corps Band. In 2019, CW4 Morgan took an MOS non-specific assignment at Ft. Leavenworth. While there she worked as a Warrant Officer curriculum developer at Army University as well as a strategic analyst for the Combined Arms Integration Directorate at the Combined Arms Center Headquarters.

CW4 Morgan has completed WOCS, WOBC, WOAC, WOILE, the Capabilities Developer course and was most recently the honor graduate for the How the Army Runs course. Her awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (3 OLC), the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal (2 OLC), and the Army Achievement Medal (3 OLC). She has one daughter, Morgan who resides in Colorado Springs, CO.
